The Conference will close with the debate among Prof. Dr. Werner Rothngatter, University of Karlsruhe, DE, Prof. Roger Vickerman, University of Kent, UK, Prof. Marco Ponti, Politecnico di Milano IT and Prof. Piet Rietveld, Vrije University of Amsterdam, NL. With so many sessions running in parallel on Transport and Social Media, on Greening Transport, on Local Public Transport, on Rail Demand and Policy Issues, Co-modality, Appraisal or Modelling to name a few you will not know what to choose! International Award for the Best Scientific Paper of a PhD student in the domain of Choice

The international award for the best scientific paper of a PhD Student in the domain of Choice Modelling was given to PhD candidate of the Shipping, Trade and Transport Dept. and member of the Transport and Decision Sciences Laboratory of the University of the Aegean, Mrs Maria Kamargianni. This paper, chosen by the Scientific Committee of the Journal of Choice Modelling, uses advanced econometric choice models to investigate the influence of the use of social networks (e.g. facebook) on the trips made by adolescents for social purpose. The award ceremony took place during the International Choice Modelling Conference on the 4th of July 2013, in Sydney, Australia.

AET Board meeting, June 2013, Rome

The 50th meeting of the Board of the Association for European Transport took place on the 13th of June, 2013, at the offices of NET engineering, in Rome, Italy. All major issues concerning the day to day governance of the Association were discussed and necessary actions were assigned. New Contracts for Administrative Services, Promotion, Marketing and Communications and Membership Secretariat Services were awarded since April 2013. The Conference Programme, the peer review procedure for selected Conference papers and the Conference location from 2016 on were also discussed.

Board membership news: Pete Snelson, AET Board Chair since October 2010, will step down in October this year and Hans Jeekel, current Board Secretary will take over as the new Chair. Peter Burge will join the Board from October 2013 as the new Board Secretary. All Board members have expressed their gratitude to Pete Snelson for all the time and effort he has put to the affairs of the Association, resulting in the new AET Vision and in substantial savings for AET.

AET Council News

AET Council meeting, June 2013, Rome

AET Council met on the 14th of March, 2013 at the offices of NTV (Nuovo Transporto Viaggiatori) in Rome, Italy. A very interesting presentation was given by Dr Giusepe Bonollo (NTV) on the new High Speed Railway Network in Italy. On the context of the implementation of AET Vision 2020, Deputy Chair Hermann Maier presented his paper on AET Governance. The specific roles of Council members and the necessity of closer interaction among Council and Board members were discussed. Working groups on specific issues of interest to the Association, involving both Council and Board members were introduced. Vice Chair Alison Irvine presented a paper on post ETC 2016 locations.

Board member Pierluigi Coppola was the host and made necessary arrangements for both the Board and Council meetings in Rome, with the help of Programme Committee member Francis Cirianni. Many thanks to both!

AET Council Elections

AET Council members usually serve for a time period up to three years. AET Council elections take place annually to fill any vacant seats. Stage 1 of the AET Council elections (voting by correspondence) is to be completed by Tuesday 24 September 2013, when the sealed envelopes should arrive at AET's address. Stage 2 (voting in person) will take place on Tuesday 1st October, during the lunch break and at the General Assembly. This year there are seven candidates for nine seats, but it is still necessary to hold the elections to ensure that all candidates are considered suitable by the members of the Association.
