The programme committees also propose broad themes for the upcoming conference to ensure ETC stays topical and focussed on the crucial transport issues of the day.



CONFERENCE FORMAT

The conference will be held over three days from Wednesday 17 to Friday 19 September 2025. Networking opportunities and technical visits will be available throughout, with optional social events offered during the evenings.

Stimulating Sessions

A key aspect of the conference is its scope, which covers the whole range of policy implications of research as well as technical details on data analyses or the design and operation of a model. Its reputation has been built on the important collaboration and knowledge transfer between policy, research and practice.

There will be a mix of plenary sessions, some debates and parallel workshop sessions. Each day, there will be a minimum of 9 parallel seminars in sessions of 1.5 or 2 hours, which include three to four papers presented in a themed session. The chair of each session ensures that there is time for questions and discussion of papers. Registered delegates may move freely between seminars.

- Plenary sessions on key topics, with keynote speeches given by prominent individuals in world transport
- Presentation of over 240 papers

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PRESENTING OUR ETC 2024 AWARD WINNERS

ETC is the home of four awards:

- Neil Mansfield Award for the best paper from a sole author aged 35 or under. The Award is administered by the Young Researchers' and Practitioners' Forum. The winner of the Neil Mansfield Award 2024, at the 52nd ETC is Marco Sala for the paper:
 - "Smart Road assessment: analysis of impacts on levels of service, emissions and road safety". Judges noted that: "This very well-structured paper presents an excellent study, with a robust analysis and bringing a positive contribution to the industry and research on the topic."
- Jacobs Data Award for the paper showing the most innovative use of Data in transport policy, practice or research. The winner of the 2024 Jacobs Award is:

"Overcoming Population Bias: Pathways to Enhance Smartcard Data with Home Location and Trip Purpose Information" by **Joe Fenwick** of Public Transport Service Planning, Transport for London. This paper was co-authored by **Howard Wong & Sophie Levi-Kallin.**

- Goudappel Land-Use / Transportation Award for the best paper presented in the Planning for Sustainable Land Use and Transport seminar stream. The Goudappel award was awarded to Carlijn van der Sluijs, Lara Borst and Kobus Zantema (Working at the municipality of Amsterdam in the Netherlands). Their paper "Sustainable strategies for urban infrastructure: a datadriven approach to bridge and quay wall restoration in Amsterdam" was chosen as the unanimous winner.
- ETC 2025 introduces the Fabio Casiroli Award for the best paper focusing on the concept of time-based urban mobility, in relation to accessibility, proximity, and social, economic and environmental sustainability. This new award has been sponsored by Systematica and is respectfully dedicated to the memory of their founder.
