The committee seeks discussion with policy makers, attracting ideas from academics and solutions from practitioners to understand these impacts and their consequences for the transport system.

The committee is interested in papers for presentation and discussions related to Innovative Approach and Methodology in Policy Analysis, Mobility Planning and Project outcome Assessment involving Geopolitics, Climate change, Migrations, Disabilities, Social, Racial and Gender Equity, Diversity, Accessibility, Inclusion, Sustainability, Resilience, Isolation, Active mobility, New technologies, Ageing, Automation, Smart mobility, North vs South, Micro vs Mass Mobility, and Quality related impacts on Transport with ideas for improved population health and well-being.
