

ETC 2022: RETURN TO THE IN-PERSON CONFERENCE

For our 50th Jubilee, the Association for European Transport will hold ETC 2022 in-person at the Politecnico di Milano, Bovisa campus. The conference has been held successfully online in 2020 and 2021 but part of the real value of ETC is in the networking opportunities, the ability to make new connections and reaffirm old professional friendships.

There is no substitute for those impromptu encounters during coffee breaks when discussion among delegates generates new ideas and contacts.

WHAT TO EXPECT AT ETC 2022

The conference attracts transport policy makers, practitioners and researchers from all over Europe and beyond. ETC offers in-depth presentations on policy issues, best practices and research findings across the broad spectrum of transport. Key themes this year explore:

- The Future of Cities: Emerging new travel and land use patterns
- **Behaviour Change:** The impacts of the climate emergency and COVID-19 on long term travel patterns
- **Travel Data:** When will new travel pattens be stable enough to inform modelling and forecasting?
- **COVID Recovery:** Funding and financial sustainability of public transport
- The Future of Aviation: Compatibility of recovery and sustainability

The unique range of topics and the multi-seminar approach makes ETC the premier transport conference.

The conference programme covers supranational issues, national and local policy and the implementation of projects at a local level.

CONFERENCE FORMAT

The conference will be held over three days from Wednesday 07 to Friday 09 September 2022. Networking opportunities and technical visits will be available throughout, with optional social events offered during the evenings.

Stimulating Sessions

A key aspect of the conference is its scope which covers the whole range of policy implications of research as well as technical details on data analyses or the design and operation of a model. Its reputation has been built on the important collaboration and knowledge transfer between policy, research and practice.

There will be a mix of plenary sessions, debates and parallel workshop sessions. Each day, there will be a minimum of 9 parallel seminars in sessions of 1.5 or 2 hours, which include three to four papers presented in a themed session. The chair of each session ensures that there is ample time for questions and discussion of papers.

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
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BOOKING INFORMATION


