The Programme Committee therefore invites you to submit abstracts of relevance to the following themes but will also consider abstracts on topics of your choice and of relevance to your current work which are interesting for an international audience:

Emerging Challenges: COVID 19 and Climate Change

- The future of rail transport (especially after COVID-19)
- The balance of passenger flows Keeping commuters by prioritising long-distance business and leisure segments?
- (New) markets: more European tourism on rail instead of worldwide air travel? Regional leisure on the weekend?
- Low carbon: which investments necessary to boost both passenger and freight on rail?

Demand Side / Consumer Perspective

- Quality aspects of transport, customer experience and their effect on demand (choices)
- Passenger information and ticketing for the seamless (international) journey
- Crowding and wayfinding at station/platform

Policy Focus

- TEN-T revision 2021: new horizons for cross-border rail and regional accessibility?
- EC-Action Plan 2021 on cross-border long-distance rail: potential and implications
- Overall effectiveness of EU policy of implementation
- Strategies for Eastern Europe
- Devolution in decision making the relationship between national, regional and local government

- Which markets to tap: air, coach or car?
