
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Welcome!

Conference Basics

- Conference dates: Wednesday 17 to Friday 19 September 2025 (welcome drinks on the evening of Tuesday 16 September)
- Venue: <u>University of Antwerp, Belgium, Building R</u>. All sessions will be in this building, except the
 opening plenary (building K). See map below. Access through the courtyard on Lange
 Winkelstraat or Rodestraat 14.
- You will find the registration desk to your left when entering through the courtyard entrance of the building.

Travel to Antwerp by train or bus

- We encourage you to travel to Antwerp by train or bus. Antwerp is well connected and easy to reach from many countries in Europe. International railway lines such as Thalys and Eurostar link Brussels and Antwerp to several other major European cities. You can also travel to Antwerp with international bus lines such as Eurolines or Flixbus.
- International tickets for train and/or bus can be booked through a number of online platforms, such as <u>Omio</u>, <u>RailEurope</u> and <u>Trainline</u>, or obtained from train operators like <u>SNCB</u> <u>International</u>, <u>DB</u> and <u>NS International</u>.

- The conference venue is a 15 minute walk or 5 minute bike ride from Antwerp Central Station.

Travel to Antwerp by air

- Nearest international airports are Brussels Airport Zaventem and Brussels South Charleroi Airport.
- Travel to Antwerp city centre from Brussels Airport Zaventem by train or bus.
 - o By train: time schedules and fares are available on the Belgian Railways website.
 - By bus: take the Airport Express. There are two stops in Antwerp: Franklin Rooseveltplaats (Platform B5 - next to the opera house and 400 metres from the central train station) and Crowne Plaza Hotel (Gerard le Grellelaan 10, Antwerp).
 - Travel to Antwerp city centre from Brussels South Charleroi Airport by bus and train: take a
 bus to the Charleroi train station and travel to Antwerp by train. Check the time schedules
 and fares on the website of the Belgian Railways.
- Alternative airports are Eindhoven Airport and Amsterdam Schiphol Airport, both in The Netherlands.
 - o From Eindhoven Airport, travel to Antwerp by taking the bus to Eindhoven Station and then the train to Antwerp Central. The journey will take from 1.30 2 hours. To book tickets and for times, check the <u>NS International website</u>. There is also a <u>Flixbus</u> service that operates once a day at 12.55pm to Antwerp Roosevelt which will take approximately 1.05 hours.
 - From Amsterdam Schiphol Airport, you can travel to Antwerp Central Station by train. To book tickets and for times, check the NS International website.

Where to Stay in Antwerp

Medical insurance

We advise you to take out travel and medical insurance. Those from EU countries will need a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) to obtain health care in Belgium. The card can be obtained from government health departments or your health insurance in all EU countries.

Visas

If you need a visa to attend the conference please apply as soon as possible to the Belgian Embassy in your country, as the processing of visas can take some time.
