ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The conference attracts transport policy makers, practitioners and researchers from all over Europe and beyond. At ETC, they can find in-depth presentations on policy issues, best practice and research findings across the broad spectrum of transport. The multi-stream format makes ETC the most wide-ranging among European transport conferences and it has established itself as the premier event of its type in Europe.

The conference programme encompasses local, regional, national and international issues and the planning and execution of projects. Discussion covers matters from the highest economic, social and environmental policy goals through transnational, regional and local policies, programmes and projects; ETC incorporates all levels of experience.

How is the ETC programme developed?

The conference takes an open, participative approach to the development of its programme. AET Members can join a programme committee where they participate in the selection of abstracts; members and delegates shape the conference (see P14). The programme committees also propose themes for the upcoming conference to ensure ETC stays topical and focussed on the key issues of the times.

CONFERENCE FORMAT

The conference will be held over three days from Wednesday 18 to Friday 20 September 2024. Networking opportunities and technical visits will be available throughout, with optional social events offered during the evenings.

Cross-Disciplinary Collaboration

ETC's reputation has been built on the important collaboration and knowledge transfer between research, theory, policy and practice – there are ample opportunities for delegates following the different streams to meet, talk and share ideas.

There will be a mix of plenary sessions, themed seminars, some debates and parallel workshop sessions. Each day, there will be a minimum of nine parallel streams each with seminars of 1.5 or 2 hours, which include three to four papers presented in a themed session; delegates may move freely between streams. The chair of each seminar arranges time for delegate questions and discussion of papers.

Conference language

The language of the conference is English, and all presentations will be made in English.

Travel to Antwerp

- By direct train from Amsterdam, Berlin, Brussels, Lille and Paris. Single change of train in Brussels - Cologne, Frankfurt, London, Luxembourg, Lyon, and many others.
- BlaBlaCar Bus and FLiXBUS coach service from many major European cities to Antwerp.
- Ferries from Hull Zeebrugge then train to Antwerp, or from Harwich - Hook of Holland then metro + train.
- Rideshare by using one of the many carpooling apps.
- By Air: To Brussels International then direct train. To Amsterdam Schiphol then direct train. To Antwerp International then bus and train.

NB: Please note that only permit holders may park on the street in Antwerp's city centre, which also operates a Low Emission Zone. Please check restrictions before your visit.
